YEAR 7 VISUAL ART EXCURSION



In Semester 1, the Year 7 Specialist Art class explored the Swan River's themes and aesthetics, its waterways, flora and fauna, Noongar culture, and the experiences of the first settlers. In April, the class visited the river's eco-education centre to learn more about the river and to engage in contemplative and meditative drawing sessions along its banks. Each student then received four paper panels depicting a river running through them to experiment with various media: charcoal, paint, watercolour, and collage. These experiments were in preparation for their large-scale canvas work, which will be showcased at the SVAPA Middle School Visual Art exhibition at the end of the year.

PICA EXCURSION



The last-minute excursion to the Perth Institute of Contemporary Art (PICA) was a success, echoing the SVAPA program's interdisciplinary ethos. The excursion explored themes of performance and exhibition through "WHEN I AM NOT THERE," a performance exhibition by Naarm (Melbourne)-based artist Shelley Lasica. Lasica's work, spanning over four decades, integrates choreography with various artistic disciplines, and this exhibition featured dancers interacting with objects in PICA's galleries.

The students participated in two artist-led workshops. One, led by performers from STRUT Dance, focused on choreographing movement, while the other, led by artist and filmmaker Jacqui Shelton, focused on performance documentation. SVAPA LONDON TOUR



An incredible and successful tour during the April holidays saw 30 students from Years 9-11 travelling to London to experience a variety of arts opportunities.
